City of Ypsilanti Non-Motorized Advisory Committee 2019 Proposed Committee Priorities

1. City Non-Motorized Plan – Complete update by February 2019
2. Sidewalk curb cut inventory & improvements
3. Pedestrian Improvements – Signage, road markings, permanent radar speed signs at select locations, traffic calming
4. Bike Lanes – West Cross Street, Harriet/Spring/Factory/Maus
5. Communication – Non-Motorized Advisory Committee recognized to be a part of non-motorized project planning. Invite Mayor, City Council members to Committee meetings, quarterly Non-Motorized Committee newsletter.
6. Non-Motorized City budget – How much, yearly, is available for non-motorized projects? Committee involvement in disbursement decisions.
7. Bike Boulevard (also referred to as a neighborhood greenway, neighborway, etc) low-speed street which has been "optimized" for bicycle & walking traffic. Potential projects: Adams (Harriet to Jarvis), Pearl (Hamilton to Mansfield), 2nd Avenue (Michigan to Watling).
