Elize Jekabson of the Ypsilanti Downtown Development Authority gave an update. Commissioner Thompson expressed a desire to have a trial run of a busking policy around the holiday season of 2021.

b) Artist and Community Survey

Commissioner McAtee presented a plan, and Elize Jekabson discussed ways to handle funding from the Tremaine Foundation. Resolution 2021-06 was approved.

Resolution 2021-06

Resolved by the Art Commission of the City of Ypsilanti:

WHEREAS, the Arts Commission desires to cultivate a community culture and environment that embraces and nurtures artistic and creative assets; and

WHEREAS, the Arts Commission desires to promote and further diversity, equity, and inclusion of all of Ypsilanti in the arts; and

WHEREAS, the Arts Commission desires to collect information from the community about the arts to inform the Commission in its role with the city, share this information with local, state, and national arts organizations, and provide insight on the current state of the arts in Ypsilanti.

WHEREAS, the Arts Commission wishes to recommend implementation of the Community and Artists Survey Ypsilanti Art Commission Action Plan, and the Request for Qualifications for the Community and Artists Survey Outreach Consultant; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Arts Commission of the City of Ypsilanti, that this resolution be provided to the city manager and city council for recommendation.

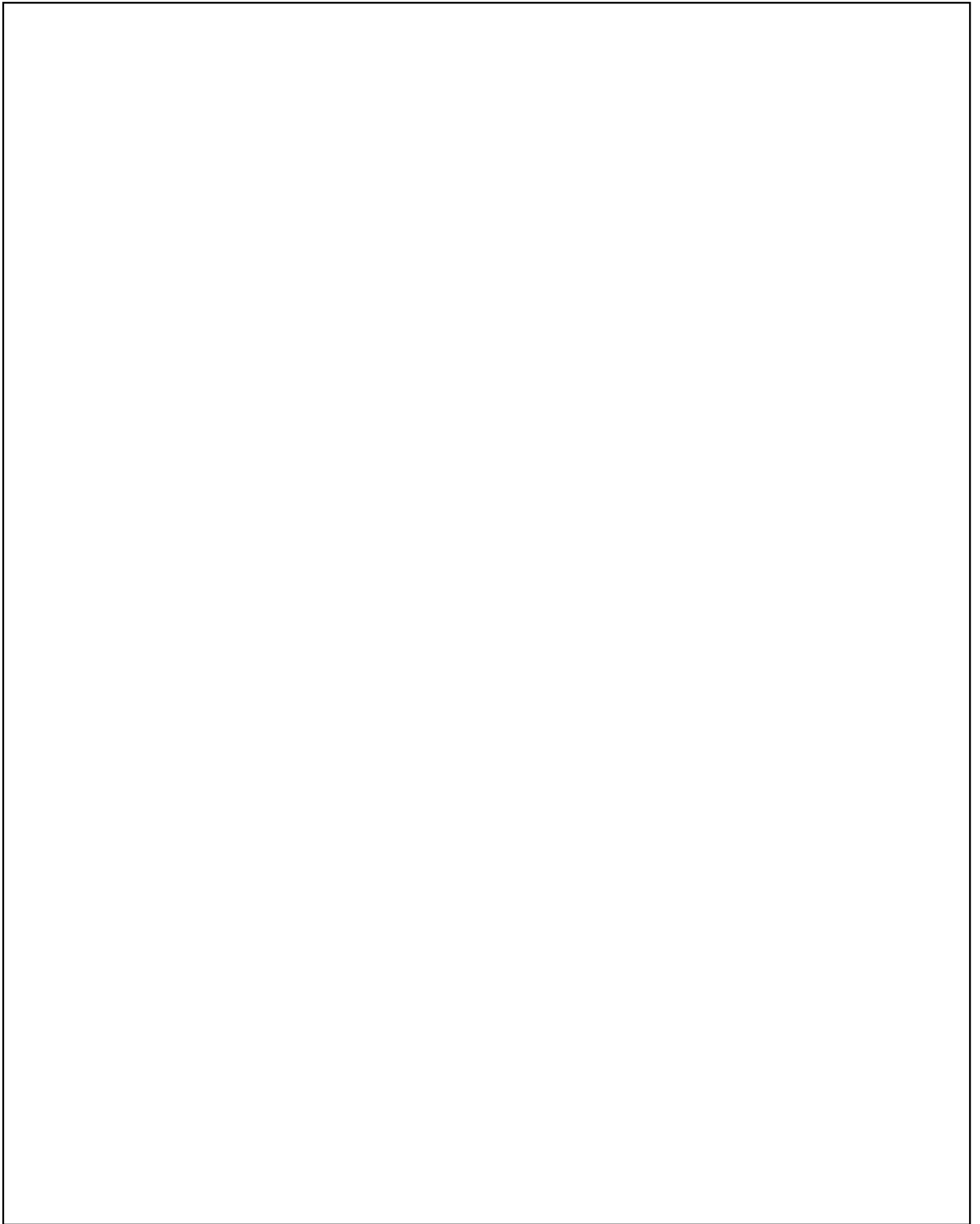
