

Roads

If you have any concerns with the roadways such as potholes, road signs that are knocked down or missing, traffic signals that are out, you can report your issue online at cityofypsilanti.com/report or by phone at 734-483-1421.

Stormwater

The City's storm drains flow directly into the Huron River or Paint Creek (part of the Stony Creek watershed). Storm runoff is not treated before entering the river or creek. The City performs regular maintenance and inspection of its stormwater system. We encourage adjoining property owners, businesses, and residents to "adopt a storm drain" and to help keep their nearby storm drains free of litter and other debris.

The City's storm drains are disconnected from YCUA's sanitary sewer drains. Severe roadway flooding should be reported to Dispatch at 734-994-2911.

If you see illegal dumping into curbside drains and ditches, call 1-800-292-4706 to report it. For hazardous chemical or flammable spills, call 9-1-1 immediately.

Public Trees

The City maintains trees in public rights of way, parks, and other public lands of the City. The City prioritizes trimming and removal based on assessment of relative safety. The City cannot perform work on trees adjacent to or within ten feet of power and other utility lines.

Trash

Please place your trash can(s) at the curb after 6:00pm the night before your trash day to ensure timely collection. **It must be at the roadside no later than 5:00am on the day of collection.** Remaining items must be removed from the roadway by 6:00am the day after your pickup day.

Do not place your cans in the roadway.

Trash items must be fully contained inside a trash can or bag. Please do not pack, overflow or stack items on top of the lid. The lid should be closed. **No loose trash will be collected.** This helps to prevent both wildlife issues and litter issues.

- Each single-family home may set out 3 trash cans or bags, each 32 gallons or smaller, and 1 bulk item each week.
- Each 2-unit dwelling may set out 6 trash cans or bags, each 32 gallons or smaller, and 2 bulk items each week.
- Each 3-unit dwelling may set out 9 trash cans or bags, each 32 gallons or smaller, and 3 bulk items each week.

We accept: If you have **extra bags** of rubbish, stickers may be purchased at City Hall for \$2.50 per sticker/per bag. Each bag of rubbish over the limit will require a sticker. For **extra bulk items**, stickers may be purchased at City Hall for \$20 per each additional item. These stickers must be purchased at least two days before your scheduled trash pickup and placed on each bulk item.

We do not accept: Antifreeze/Gasoline/Motor Oil, Automobile Batteries, Tires/Vehicle Parts, Hazardous Waste Materials, Insecticides, Liquids, Oil-Based Paints, Propane Tanks, Brick/Cement Blocks, Building/Lumber Debris, Roofing Shingles, Dirt/Sod, Gravel/Rock/Stones, Tree Stumps, Railroad Ties, Computer Monitors, Hot Tubs, Pianos. **Items containing Freon or other refrigerant, including dehumidifiers, window a/c units, fridges, and freezers will not be accepted curbside** and MUST be taken to a site equipped to handle safe refrigerant disposal.

In fall of 2025 the City will be transitioning to vendor-supplied 95-gallon trash bins. Stay tuned for more!

Curbside Collection of Trash, Recycling, and Yard Waste

One- and Two-Family Residences

Please put the below magnet on your refrigerator for a quick reference.

Find your trash day on the Recycle Magnet Schedule. Trash collection is weekly. Recycle and yard waste collection are every other week. The dates listed below your trash day are your 2025 Recycle Collection Dates. Please note that recycle dates listed in **red** are a one-day delay due to a holiday. If your trash, yard waste, and recycle collection day falls on the day of a holiday or on the days following a holiday, you will experience a one-day delay in all services that week. If your recycle day does not fall in a holiday week, your recycle collection will not be delayed. More information on curbside trash, recycling, and yard waste collection can be found on the following page.

Please note that rubbish pickup delays and administrative holidays may not be the same.

Multifamily Homes and Commercial Establishments

Multifamily properties with up to 4 units and commercial businesses may be eligible to participate in curbside recycling collection. Visit cityofypsilanti.com/recycle for more information. Residents who cannot participate in curbside recycling are encouraged to use the Recycle Ann Arbor Drop Off Station. Please note that commercial businesses are ineligible for this free drop-off pass provided by the City.

Service Changes Possible in 2025

The Department of Public Works yard will be undergoing significant construction in summer 2025, and as a result there may be changes or delays to some Department of Public Works services, like curbside collection. Recycling

Please place your recycle cart at the curb after 6:00pm the night before your pickup day to ensure timely collection. It must be at the roadside no later than 6:00am on the day of collection. Remaining items must be removed from the roadway by 6:00am the day after your pickup day. **Do not place your cart in the roadway.**

All items must be contained inside the cart; do not stack items on top of the lid. All containers should be empty and dry. **Please note that if our pickup crews see material that we cannot accept curbside in your cart, we will not pick up the cart.** DO NOT BAG your recycle items. No items outside the cart will be accepted.

We accept:

- Plastic bottles and containers (numbered 1, 2, and 5)
- Aluminum and steel cans
- Cartons
- Glass bottles and jars
- Flattened cardboard (no food or grease; no pizza boxes)
- Newspaper, junk mail, mixed paper—all colors and types

We do not accept plastic bags, plastic wrap, pizza boxes, Styrofoam, soft foam, bubble wrap, wet paper/cardboard, or shredded paper curbside. These are contaminants and will be rejected.

If you need to recycle items that we do not accept curbside, or a large volume of items, City of Ypsilanti residents are eligible to sign up for a pass to use Recycle Ann Arbor's Drop-Off Station at a reduced rate. Fill out the electronic form on cityofypsilanti.com/recycle to request the pass. Same-day passes are also available at City Hall.

Yard Waste

Please place your bundled, bagged, or contained yard waste at the curb after 6:00pm the night before your pickup day to ensure timely collection. It must be at the roadside no later than 6:00am on your day of collection. Remaining items must be removed from the roadway by 6:00am the day after your pickup day.

Do not place your yard waste in the roadway.

You may put out as many bags, containers, or bundles as you need, but yard waste will only be picked up if it is contained in paper compost bags (available at local stores) or a 32-gallon container labeled as YARD WASTE; or bundled brush/branches no more than 4" in diameter each and 4' in length. Any item (bag, container, or bundle) must weigh less than 50 pounds.


If overnight rain is expected, please store yard waste bags in a dry location and place at the curb by 6:00am on your collection day. If an item weighs more than 50 pounds or a bag will break if picked up, we will not pick it up.

During colder months, use compost bags instead of containers. Leaves that are frozen in containers cannot be removed.

We accept grass clippings, vines, leaves, weeds, garden debris, shrubs and brush trimmings that are less than 4" in diameter.

We do not accept dirt, sod, animal droppings, trash, kitchen compost, branches over 4" in diameter, wood chips, stumps, wood, logs, rocks, mulch, root balls, invasive species, or landscaping timbers.

If you have yard waste we don't accept curbside, such as stumps, City residents are eligible for up to four free passes per year to use the Ypsilanti Township compost facility on Clark Road. Passes are available at the Clerk's office in City Hall and must be obtained before visiting the facility. Proof of residency is required. Christmas trees will be collected curbside on January 10, 17, and 24 in 2025.

The Ypsilanti Fire Department (YFD) is a comprehensive, full-time fire department that provides fire services to the City of Ypsilanti and Eastern Michigan University. The men and women of the YFD are dedicated to serving the citizens, businesses, students, and visitors of the City of Ypsilanti.

Residential Fire Prevention Requirements:

- Smoke detector for rental units & new homes
- Fire extinguisher & carbon monoxide detectors for rental units

Smoke Detectors for Homeowners

- YFD will provide smoke detectors to homeowners who call 734-482-9778

Open Source Fires or Open Burning

- No bonfires, rubbish fires, yard waste fires, or lighting of sky lanterns.
- No grills that use a solid fuel (charcoal, wood, etc.) on covered porches/patios or within 10 feet of any structure. Propane or gas grills are permitted.
- Use of an outdoor fireplace equipped with a spark arrester is permitted if it is used in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations, is at least 25 feet from any structure, and is maintained in good condition.
- Burning that is offensive or objectionable because of smoke or odor must be extinguished immediately.
- Outdoor fires may be permitted, when constantly attended and at least 25 feet from any structure, if you use seasoned fire wood only and there is a means of extinguishment close by.

Fees

Persons who cause YFD to respond due to a violation such as those discussed in this section are responsible for the YFD's cost and expenses. The fee for each such response in a calendar year is:

First occurrence: \$0 and a Warning Second occurrence: \$200

Third occurrence: \$400 Each additional occurrence adds \$200

The Treasurer's Office is responsible for processing property tax bills, issuing City parking passes, accepting parking ticket payments and appeal forms, and collecting other payments owed to the City.

Property Taxes

Taxes may be paid by mail, in person at the Treasurer's Office, via the drop box at the entry to City Hall, or online. Postmarks are NOT honored. If the tax due date falls on a weekend, payments are accepted through the next business day without interest or penalty. All checks returned for non-payment incur a fee. Payment made by credit card incurs an additional service fee.

Summer Bill – mailed July 1 and due September 14.

On September 15, 1% interest is added to any unpaid balance. An additional 1% is added on the first of each month thereafter until paid in full.

Winter Bill – mailed December 1 and due February 14.

On February 15, any unpaid balance will have a 3% penalty added. Payment must be received by the due date to avoid interest/penalty.

Please note: On March 1, all unpaid real property taxes are transferred to the Washtenaw County Treasurer as delinquent. Contact the County Treasurer at (734) 222-6600 for balance due.

Eligible senior citizens and service persons with a household income of \$40,000 or less may apply for a deferment to extend the deadline to pay property taxes without penalty or interest on a principal residence.

Working in partnership with the community, the members of the Ypsilanti Police Department are dedicated to improving the quality of life and providing a safe environment within the community and the organization.

For Non-Emergent Police Response: There are 3 options for filing a non-emergency police report:

1. At your location — Call non-emergency dispatch and request that an officer be sent to your location.
2. At the Police Station — If outside business hours, use the call button/ call box located on the building for Dispatch and an officer will respond.
3. Online at cityofypsilanti.com/crimereporting for these incidents:
 - Harassing phone calls/No known suspects
 - Identity Theft/ No known suspects
 - Larceny/Theft/ No Known Suspects
 - Lost Property
 - Damaged Property / Vandalism
 - Private property traffic crash/ Parked unattended, returned to find had been struck
 - Accidental/Non Intentional Property Damage
 - Threats

The Clerk's Office is responsible for functions including the administration of all City elections, registering and maintaining City residents' voter information, maintaining statutory records, administering the Administrative Hearings Bureau, and processing Peddler Permit requests and Liquor License Applications. The Clerk's Office also maintains proposed and approved Ordinances and Resolutions and prepares City Council meeting agendas and packets.

WORK AN ELECTION WITH US!

The best way to learn and understand the election process is to work one. We provide all necessary training. Please join our team! Applications are available in the Clerk's office or on the City's website.

THREE WAYS TO VOTE IN MICHIGAN

1. Absentee Voting:

Absentee voting is voting absent from the polls. These ballots are turned into the Clerk's Office in person, by mail, or to drop boxes and are counted on election day.

Drop box locations are located at City Hall, Parkridge Community Center, and at the Student Center at Eastern Michigan University. These drop boxes are checked regularly by Clerks' Office staff and approved election workers ONLY.

Permanent Absent Voter Ballot List

Voters may check a box on the Absent Voter Ballot Application to indicate that they wish to join the Permanent Absent Voter Ballot List. The voter will automatically receive an Absentee Voter Ballot Application before every election in which they are eligible to participate. The voter can choose whether or not they would like to submit the application to receive a ballot.

Please note that ballots CANNOT be forwarded by the postal service. If you will be at a different address at the time of the election, please call the Clerk's Office to update your mailing address.

2. Early Voting/ Early In-Person Voting:

This is a nine-day period of in-person early voting that always begins the second Saturday before State and Federal elections and ends the Sunday before an election. Ypsilanti voters can vote early at the Freighthouse (100 Market St.) or the Washtenaw County Learning Resource Center (4135 Washtenaw Ave.).

3. Vote on Election Day At Your Polling Location:

Voting at your assigned polling location on election day will remain the same in 2025.

The Assessment Department is responsible for the annual valuation of all taxable real and personal property within the City as of "Tax Day" (Dec. 31). Common forms and more information is available on the website.

Homeowners

- **Property Transfer Affidavit**
Due within 45 days of a transfer of ownership.
- **Principal Residence Exemption**
The Principal Residence Exemption (P.R.E.) is an exemption of the 18 mills school operating for the one home you own and occupy as your primary residence. The deadline to file is June 1 for the summer tax levies.

Business Owners

Small Business Property Tax Exemption Claim (L-5076)

Eligible Manufacturing Personal Property Tax

Exemption Claim (L-5278)

If the combined true cash value of all business personal property is less than \$80,000, your business qualifies to file a form L-5076 resulting in an exemption from personal property taxation. If you qualify as a manufacturing business, a form L-5278 can be filed with the Department.

These forms are due by February 20 for the year of exemption.

The Building Division is responsible for building permit administration, rental housing inspections, and business inspections. It is important to secure a building permit to ensure that your project is structurally sound and complies with building and zoning codes. All rental housing is required to conform to certain standards of safety, conforming rentals will receive a Certificate of Compliance. People can apply for permits, book appointments, make payments, and check the status of your applications online, including checking the status of rental certification.

If the sewer main is observed to be restricted, YCUA will remedy the issue. If the sewer main is flowing properly, the homeowner will be advised to call a plumber to have their sewer lead cleaned out.
